Be it resolved that the Springfield Board of Education “SFA” approves the renewal of the Food Service Management contract with The Pomptonian, Inc. “FSMC” for the food service operation for 2020-2021.

The FSMC shall receive, in addition to the costs of operation, an administrative/management fee of \$0.1912 per reimbursable meal and meal equivalent to compensate the FSMC for administrative and management costs. This fee shall be billed monthly as a cost of operation. The SFA guarantees the payment of such costs and fee to the FSMC.

Total meals are calculated by adding reimbursable meal pattern meals served and meal equivalents. The number of reimbursable meals served to the children shall be determined by actual count. Cash receipts, other than from sales of reimbursable program meals served to the children, shall be divided by \$3.66 to arrive at an equivalent meal count.

The per meal administrative/management fee of \$0.1912 will be multiplied by total meals.

The FSMC guarantees the SFA a Breakeven (0 Cost) Operation for school year 2020-2021.

5112 ENTRANCE AGE

The Board will admit to the school district children otherwise eligible by law or Board policy who have attained the age requirements set by law and this Board. The Board requires documentary verification of the age and birthdate of any child for whom admission to the school district is sought.

Preschool Disabled

A child is eligible for entrance into a program of special education who has attained his/her third birthday and has been found by the Child Study Team to be eligible for a program for the preschool disabled in accordance with rules of the State Board of Education.

Pre-Kindergarten

Any child residing in the school district shall be admitted to the Pre-Kindergarten provided:

- A. The child will have attained the age of four years on or before October 1 of that school year;
- B. Proof shall be furnished of immunization against the communicable diseases at the time of enrollment or such immunization shall be completed within thirty days from date of entry into the school;
- C. The child shall have been examined by either the school or a private physician, and the results shall be furnished to the school on the form provided; and
- D. The child in an unusual case may be given a standard test, and the school district so may collect additional student profile information to determine if an individual exception should be made.

Kindergarten

Any child residing in the school district shall be admitted to the Kindergarten provided:

- A. The child will have attained the age of five years on or before October 1 of that school year;

- B. Proof shall be furnished of immunization against the communicable diseases at the time of enrollment or such immunization shall be completed within thirty days from date of entry into the school;
- C. The child shall have been examined by either the school or a private physician, and the results shall be furnished to the school on the form provided; and
- D. The child in an unusual case may be given a standard test, and the school district staff may collect additional student profile information to determine if an individual exception should be made.

Grade One

Any child residing in the school district shall be admitted to grade one provided:

- A. The child will have attained the age of six years on or before October 1 of that school year;
- B. He/she has been in the first grade in another public school;
- C. He/she has completed Kindergarten in a public or private school and been recommended for placement in first grade by meeting district standards; and
- D. Proof has been furnished of immunization against communicable diseases.
