- **Reason for the pesticide application:** Bird Mite infestation.
- **Description of the problem and the factors that qualified the problem as an emergency that threatened the health or safety of a student or staff member:** Infestation throughout entire Media Center, potential of staff or student member being bitten by mites.
- **If applicable, description of steps to be taken to avoid emergency use of pesticides for this problem in the future:** Elimination of potential nesting sites for birds.
- **Description of the possible adverse effects of the pesticide(s) as per the Material Safety Data Sheets for the pesticide(s) to be used, if available:**
Exciter: Symptoms of Acute Exposure: Ingestion: May cause gastrointestinal effects, such as nausea, cramps, vomiting and diarrhea. Ingestion of large quantities can result in nervous system effects, such as dizziness, loss of coordination, tremors, and loss of consciousness. Symptoms usually regress with no long lasting effects. At high oral doses, the type of solvent in this product has caused irreversible damage to the liver and kidney (male only) in rats. These effects are not relevant to humans at occupational levels of exposure. Eyes: May cause temporary eye irritation. Skin: May be irritating to skin. Repeated contact may cause dermatitis. Inhalation: May cause nasal and respiratory irritation at high concentrations. Medical Conditions Generally Aggravated by Exposure: None known. Evercide Permethrin 10% E.C.: Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through skin. Causes moderate eye irritation. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, or using tobacco. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse. P.I Contact Insecticide: Keep out of reach of children. CAUTION – Harmful if absorbed through skin. Avoid contact with eyes, skin, or clothing. Wash hands before eating, drinking, chewing gum, or using the toilet.

- **Pesticide product label instructions and precautions related to public safety:**
Exciter: Harmful if swallowed or inhaled. Causes eye irritation. Avoid breathing spray mist. Avoid contact with eyes. Wear protective clothing. Wash skin thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Remove contaminated clothing and wash clothing before reuse. Evercide Permethrin 10% E.C.: **POTENTIAL HEALTH EFFECTS:** **EYES:** May cause eye injury. **SKIN:** Can cause skin irritation. Can cause a burning or prickling sensation on more sensitive areas (face, eyes, mouth). **SKIN ABSORPTION:** Harmful if absorbed through the skin. **INGESTION:** Harmful if swallowed. **INHALATION:** Excessive inhalation of mists can cause nasal and respiratory irritation. **CHRONIC:** None known. P.I Contact Insecticide: Harmful if absorbed through skin. Avoid contact with eyes, skin, or clothing. Wash hands before eating, drinking, chewing gum, or using the toilet.
